1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Empowered Child Ministries

June was a month of growth, challenges, and meaningful progress for Empowered Child Ministries. The team continued to provide comprehensive care, education, and emotional support for the children in our care, while also making infrastructure improvements and deepening community engagement. Below is a summary of key updates and developments:

Health and Wellness

- Two significant health cases were managed with care: *Halima* fully recovered from a burn injury, and *Sharif* responded well to treatment after a severe malaria episode.
- A **visiting doctor** now regularly treats the children on-site, ensuring quicker access to care and reducing long-term healthcare costs.
- Physiotherapy sessions for children with special needs continued with encouraging results, supported by a new child-friendly reward system. However, limited therapy space remains a challenge.

Education and School Reopening

- Children joyfully returned to school for the **second term**, fully supported with scholastic materials and transportation.
- **Special needs education** sessions resumed with progress noted, despite space limitations and a shortage of educational materials.
- Children also engaged in practical life skills activities like cooking and juice making to enhance development.

Nutrition and Food Security

• Due to **limited funding**, the quality of meals this month was below standard, which may affect health and academic performance. Continued donor support is needed to improve nutrition.

Spiritual Growth and Worship

Sunday services were fewer due to bad weather, but gatherings held were spiritually
enriching. Plans are underway to establish a weather-resilient space for worship to
ensure consistency.

Infrastructure and Safety Enhancements

- A **new wooden store** was built to safely house wheelchairs, bicycles, and therapy tools.
- **Shelving units** were installed in bedrooms and the kitchen, improving organization and hygiene.
- We hired **Mr. Isoba Fred** as our new security guard to enhance safety and protect ministry property.

Donor Engagement and Sponsorship

- We welcomed three new **monthly donors via PayPal**: Sandar (\$10.80), Vanessa (\$100), and Charlotte (\$21). These recurring gifts help sustain programs long-term.
- Sponsors *Trevor McEntee* and *Clara Julia* sent thoughtful care packages that brought immense joy and encouragement to the children.
- Sponsor *Nicola* generously funded **birthday celebrations**, including supermarket trips and gifts for children born in June.

Community and Emotional Support

- Magero Sylvia returned to the orphanage after a difficult year with relatives. Her reintegration has been warmly embraced by both staff and peers.
- We celebrated five children's birthdays, turning each occasion into a moment of love, joy, and belonging.

Empowered Child Ministries continues to navigate daily challenges with faith, compassion, and resilience. We remain grateful to our donors, staff, and partners whose generosity and commitment are transforming lives every day. Together, we are creating a nurturing environment where every child can thrive.



2. JUNE 2025 PROGRAM UPDATES

Health Update

During June, Empowered Child Ministries closely monitored the health and well-being of all children under its care. One of the children, Halima, experienced a burn injury caused by hot porridge. Thanks to prompt and attentive medical care, Halima recovered very well and is now back to her normal activities with no lasting effects.

Meanwhile, Sharif faced a severe bout of malaria during the month. The ministry ensured he received immediate medical attention and appropriate treatment. With proper care and rest, Sharif has made significant progress toward full recovery.

These cases highlight the ongoing commitment of the ministry to providing comprehensive healthcare support, ensuring that every child's health challenges are promptly addressed with compassion and professionalism.

New Monthly Donors Join Through PayPal

We are thrilled to welcome three new monthly donors who have chosen to partner with Empowered Child Ministries by providing ongoing financial support via PayPal. Sandar has pledged a monthly contribution of USD 10.80, Vanessa generously committed USD 100, and Charlotte is supporting us with USD 21 every month. These monthly donations are vital as they provide a reliable and predictable source of funding, enabling us to plan and sustain key programs more effectively. 


Figure 1: The children under our care returned with enthusiasm to begin the second term of the school year.

Construction of a New Wooden Store

To enhance the organization and security of our facility, we constructed a sturdy wooden store this month specifically designed to house important mobility and recreational equipment. This new storage area will securely accommodate wheelchairs, bicycles, drums, and other vital resources used daily by the children. Previously, the lack of proper storage made it challenging to keep these items safe and in good condition. The new facility will protect these assets from weather damage and unauthorized access, ensuring they remain available and functional to support the children's mobility, therapy, and recreational activities. This improvement reflects our commitment to providing a well-maintained environment that supports holistic care.

Employment of a New Security Guard

In June, we also strengthened our security team by welcoming Mr. Isoba Fred as our new security guard. His role is crucial in ensuring the safety and protection of the children, staff, and property within the ministry's premises. With increasing activities and the presence of valuable equipment, having dedicated security personnel is essential to prevent theft, vandalism, and unauthorized access. Mr. Fred's experience and vigilance will contribute significantly to creating a secure and peaceful environment where children can thrive without

fear. We are confident that his presence will also provide reassurance to staff and visitors, fostering a sense of safety and community within the ministry.




Figure 2: We also strengthened our security team by welcoming Mr. Isoba Fred as our new security guard

Sylvia had been living with relatives during a challenging season marked by instability and strained relationships. Her return is a testament to the love and safe environment that Empowered Child Ministries provides, and we are committed to walking with her on her journey of healing and restoration. The children and staff warmly received her back, and she has quickly reintegrated into the family with joy and resilience.

To continue improving our living and care environment, we installed shelves in the children's rooms, creating additional storage space for their personal belongings. These improvements have greatly enhanced our ability to maintain a clean, functional, and child-friendly environment that supports everyday life at the ministry.

Physiotherapy Progress - Supporting Children with Special Needs

Physiotherapy sessions for our children with special needs continued steadily throughout June, bringing encouraging signs of progress in many of them. These sessions remain a cornerstone of our holistic care, aimed at improving mobility, strength, coordination, and the overall physical well-being of each child.

We are grateful to **Doctor Sylve and Flavia**, who have continued to provide dedicated and compassionate therapy. Their professionalism and understanding of the children's needs have greatly contributed to the positive strides we are seeing. Several children are showing marked improvements in movement and balance, which translates to better participation in daily activities and greater independence.

However, we did face **some challenges** this month. Our therapy sessions are still **limited by space constraints**, which sometimes affects the consistency of care. We recognize the urgent need for **a more spacious and equipped area** to properly accommodate physiotherapy activities and ensure the comfort and safety of both the therapists and the children.

Despite these challenges, we remain steadfast in our commitment to providing **consistent and professional therapy services**. We continue to **pray and actively seek support** for improved infrastructure and resources that will enhance the therapy experience for all our children in need of specialized care.

To foster **enthusiasm and consistency** during therapy, we have introduced a small yet impactful **reward system** — each child now receives a sweet treat after completing their session. This simple gesture has made a noticeable difference, as it brings joy, **builds motivation**, and helps the children associate therapy with a **sense of accomplishment**. The excitement of receiving a treat encourages their participation and transforms what can be difficult exercises into a more **positive and enjoyable experience**.

Special Needs Education – Ongoing Support and Skill Development

Special needs education continued steadily in June 2025 under the care and guidance of Teacher Sarah, who worked with four of our children with special needs. These sessions focused on basic education, personal development, and life skills, and have played a vital role in helping the children grow in confidence and ability.

However, we continue to face key challenges:

- We lack sufficient special needs materials and equipment, which limits the full potential of the learning process.
- The space available for teaching is insufficient, making it hard to create an optimal environment for learning.

With the construction of our new home, we are hopeful about utilizing the larger outdoor space as a temporary learning area for our special needs children while we work toward more permanent solutions.

Additionally, the children engaged in practical activities such as cooking and juice making, which are not only therapeutic but also help them develop useful life skills.

Please note that special needs sessions were paused during the last week of May due to preparations for our relocation.

We remain committed to providing inclusive education tailored to the unique needs of every child, and we continue to seek support for expanding our capacity.

Sunday Services – A Month of Spiritual Growth Amid Challenges

This month, our Sunday services were affected by **unpredictable weather conditions**, which led to fewer sessions than usual. Despite this, the times we gathered were deeply meaningful and impactful. The children participated in worship, prayer, and Bible teachings that nurtured their **spiritual growth**, encouraged **personal reflection**, and reminded them of God's love and faithfulness.

We believe that **spiritual nourishment is just as essential as physical care**. Although the weather disrupted some of our gatherings, we remain committed to providing regular worship opportunities that **build character, instill hope**, and **foster a sense of community** among the children. We are also exploring ways to create **a more weather-resilient space** so that spiritual programs can continue uninterrupted in the future.

Nutrition and Meals - A Need for Improvement

This month, we faced **significant challenges in providing balanced and nutritious meals** due to limited funding. While we ensured the children received daily meals, the **nutritional quality was compromised**, which can affect their overall health, concentration in school, and physical development.

Proper nutrition is especially crucial for children with **special needs and medical conditions**, as well as those recovering from illness or undergoing therapy. We continue to pray for and seek partners who can support our food program so we can provide **diverse**, **nutrient-rich meals** that promote strong growth and sustained energy for learning, play, and healing.

Medical Support - A Step Forward in Healthcare Access

We are grateful to report that we now have a **doctor who visits regularly** to check on the children's health, treat minor ailments, and provide professional medical advice. This development is a **significant milestone** for Empowered Child Ministries, as it ensures **quicker response to illnesses**, **early diagnosis**, and **reduced reliance on costly external clinics**.

Having access to on-site or visiting medical care helps us **cut down on transport and treatment expenses**, improves **health monitoring**, and ensures **the well-being of our children is safeguarded more consistently**. It's a major step forward in our efforts to build a more **self-sustaining and responsive care environment**.



3. FINANCIAL REPORTS

The financial report of Empowered Child Ministries outlines a transparent and responsible management of funds, detailing budget allocation, expenditures, and funding sources. Key income streams include individual donations, partner grants, and fundraising activities, all vital to supporting the 56 children in our care.

Major expenses prioritize child welfare, covering necessities such as food, clothing, and shelter, alongside educational programs that provide learning materials and specialized support for disabled and school-going children. Healthcare costs address medical treatments, emergency care, and ongoing therapies for children with special needs.

Operational expenses, including administrative costs, utilities, and facility maintenance, are carefully controlled to ensure effective daily functioning. This encompasses upkeep of the children's home, allowances for caretakers, and essential services like electricity and water.

3.1 Collected Donations

In June 2025, Empowered Child Ministries received a total of **UGX 26,714,184**, equivalent to approximately **USD 7,632.62** or **GBP 5,936.49**, in donations. These contributions were vital in sustaining the ministry's operations and supporting the children under its care.

The largest share came through **PayPal donations**, totaling UGX 19,715,115 (USD 5,632.89 / GBP 4,381.14). Additional support included **mobile money donations** amounting to UGX 3,078,000 (USD 879.43 / GBP 684.00), **bank transfers** of UGX 1,981,222 (USD 566.06 / GBP 440.27), and **GoFundMe donations** totaling UGX 1,444,000 (USD 412.57 / GBP 320.89). The ministry also received **Western Union donations** worth UGX 495,847 (USD 141.67 / GBP 110.19).

These generous contributions directly impacted children's lives by enabling access to education, healthcare, shelter, nutrition, and spiritual development.

3.2 Expenditure

In June 2025, Empowered Child Ministries incurred a total of **UGX 24,996,666**, equivalent to approximately **USD 7,141.90** or **GBP 5,554.80**, in direct expenses supporting various aspects of its ministry operations.

The majority of the expenditure went toward **program costs**, totaling UGX 17,859,000 (USD 5,102.60 / GBP 3,968.70), which covered essential services such as education, healthcare, child welfare, and

nutrition. **Administrative expenses** amounted to UGX 5,532,066 (USD 1,580.60 / GBP 1,229.30), supporting staff allowances, office operations, and professional services. **Other operational expenses** reached UGX 1,341,000 (USD 383.10 / GBP 298.00), while **utility bills** for services like water, electricity, and sanitation came to UGX 264,600 (USD 75.60 / GBP 58.80).

These expenditures reflect the ministry's commitment to providing consistent, quality care and support to the children and families it serves.

3.3 Detailed Category Expenditure

3.3.1 Administrative Expenses

In June 2025, Empowered Child Ministries spent **UGX 5,532,066** (approximately **USD 1,580.59 / GBP 1,229.35**) on administrative expenses to support the effective running of the ministry.

Key expenses included allowances for caretakers at UGX 1,625,000, PayPal transaction charges amounting to UGX 1,720,566, and GoFundMe fees totaling UGX 643,999. The ministry also covered professional services and consultations (UGX 700,000), internet bundles (UGX 235,000), and withdrawal charges (UGX 387,500). Other administrative costs included office equipment and supplies, website maintenance, security guard and administrative work allowances, each contributing to the overall efficiency and continuity of operations. These expenses were essential to maintaining structure, communication, and service delivery across the ministry.

3.3.2 Program Costs

In June 2025, Empowered Child Ministries spent **UGX 17,859,000** (approximately **USD 5,102.60 / GBP 3,968.70**) on program-related expenses that directly benefited the children and supported ongoing ministry initiatives.

The largest allocation went toward the **education program**, totaling UGX 6,205,000, followed by **children's meals** at UGX 5,656,500, ensuring daily nourishment. Additional program support included **household items and equipment** (UGX 2,842,500), **drop-in-clinic services** (UGX 1,255,000), and **health and welfare services** (UGX 466,000). ECM also continued its **orphanage home construction**, contributing UGX 1,434,000 to this ongoing project. These investments were crucial in meeting the physical, educational, and healthcare needs of the children under the ministry's care.

i. Education Program

In June 2025, Empowered Child Ministries invested **UGX 6,205,000** (approximately **USD 1,772.90 / GBP 1,378.90**) in its education program to support the academic and spiritual development of the children.

Key expenses included **tuition fees** for both **primary** (UGX 2,150,000) and **secondary education** (UGX 1,100,000), ensuring continued access to formal schooling. The ministry also provided **scholastic materials** (UGX 1,938,000) and catered for **special needs education** (UGX 200,000) to support inclusive learning. In addition, children benefited from **dancing classes** (UGX 592,000) as part of their co-curricular development and attended **Sunday church services** (UGX 225,000), which nurtured their spiritual growth. These investments reflect ECM's holistic approach to education, addressing both academic and character development.

ii. Health and Welfare Program

In June 2025, Empowered Child Ministries allocated **UGX 466,000** (approximately **USD 133.10** / **GBP 103.60**) to its **Health & Welfare Program**, focusing on the personal well-being and care of the children.

This included **medical services** at UGX 315,000 to address health needs, along with **children's gifts and toys** (UGX 81,000) to support emotional well-being and play. Additionally, **hairdressing and assorted**

personal care items were provided at a cost of UGX 70,000. These efforts contributed to the children's holistic care, ensuring their physical health, personal hygiene, and emotional comfort.

iii. Household Activities

In June 2025, Empowered Child Ministries spent **UGX 2,842,500** (approximately **USD 812.10** / **GBP 631.70**) on household items and equipment to maintain a clean, safe, and comfortable living environment for the children.

Major expenses included **household maintenance** at UGX 1,426,000 and **home equipment and items** at UGX 465,500. Other essential purchases covered **washing soap and powder** (UGX 353,000), **barber services** (UGX 240,000), and **diapers** (UGX 100,000). The ministry also provided **toothpaste and toothbrushes**, **liquid soap**, **sponges and bathing items**, **sanitary towels**, **kitchen items**, and **clothing** to meet the children's personal hygiene and daily needs. These supplies played a vital role in promoting dignity, cleanliness, and overall well-being.

iv. Children's Meals

In June 2025, Empowered Child Ministries allocated **UGX 5,656,500** (approximately **USD 1,616.10** / **GBP 1,257.00**) toward providing nutritious meals for the children under its care.

Key food items included **maize flour** (UGX 625,000), **rice** (UGX 800,000), and **beans** (UGX 603,000), forming the staple components of daily meals. The ministry also invested in **vegetables** (UGX 573,000), **sugar** (UGX 401,000), **other food items** (UGX 1,812,500), **cooking oil** (UGX 199,000), and **fruits** (UGX 223,000), ensuring a balanced and varied diet. Additionally, **firewood** (UGX 360,000) and **salt** (UGX 60,000) supported food preparation needs. These provisions were vital in promoting the health, growth, and overall well-being of the children.

v. Drop-In-Clinic

In June 2025, Empowered Child Ministries allocated **UGX 1,255,000** (approximately **USD 358.60** / **GBP 278.90**) to its Drop-in Clinic services.

This included **donations to caretakers** amounting to UGX 375,000 and **physiotherapy sessions** valued at UGX 880,000. These funds supported essential healthcare services, ensuring the children received the medical attention and physical therapy they needed for improved well-being.

vi. Orphanage Home Construction

In June 2025, Empowered Child Ministries invested **UGX 1,434,000** (approximately **USD 409.70 / GBP 318.70**) in ongoing **orphanage home construction**.

Key expenses included **timber works** at UGX 669,000, **construction labor** costing UGX 400,000, and **iron sheets and roofing materials** valued at UGX 125,000. Additional costs covered **electricity works** (UGX 73,000), **cement** (UGX 60,000), **other construction materials** (UGX 72,000), and **transport of materials** (UGX 35,000). These investments contributed toward building a safe and nurturing home environment for the children supported by the ministry.

3.3.3 Utility Bills

In June 2025, Empowered Child Ministries incurred **UGX 264,600** (approximately **USD 75.60 / GBP 58.80**) in utility bills to support the daily functioning of the ministry.

These costs included water bills at UGX 217,000, TV subscriptions totaling UGX 37,600, and garbage collection services at UGX 10,000. These utilities ensured a clean, comfortable, and well-maintained environment for the children and staff.

3.4.3 Operational Expenses

In June 2025, Empowered Child Ministries spent **UGX 1,341,000** (approximately **USD 383.10 / GBP 298.00**) on other operational expenses supporting various logistical and celebratory activities.

This included **children's birthday parties** costing UGX 560,000, **transportation for food items** (UGX 99,000), and **general transportation of other items** at UGX 368,000. The ministry also covered **transport facilitation** expenses amounting to UGX 300,000 and **clearance and handling of packages** for UGX 14,000. These costs were essential in ensuring smooth operations and fostering a joyful environment for the children.

4. FUNDING NEEDS

Empowered Child Ministries (ECM) is facing critical challenges that require **urgent support** to continue providing a safe, loving, and nurturing environment for the vulnerable children in our care. Our mission remains rooted in restoring hope and dignity through holistic care—spiritually, emotionally, and physically. However, to sustain and grow this impact, we must urgently address several priority needs.

- Solar Panels for Reliable Power: Frequent electricity outages continue to disrupt our daily
 activities, particularly in the evening when children need lighting for study and indoor safety.
 Installing a solar power system will provide a reliable and sustainable energy source, ensuring that
 operations continue uninterrupted and the children have the lighting they need for learning and
 comfort.
- Healthcare & Medical Support: Our children require routine medical check-ups, emergency treatments, and, for some, specialized physiotherapy. Consistent funding is essential to meet these needs and ensure that every child receives the medical attention necessary to thrive physically and emotionally.
- Skills Development Programs: We are committed to empowering children with life skills that
 foster independence. One of our active initiatives includes vocational training in liquid soapmaking, which not only equips children with practical skills but also builds their confidence and
 opens future income-generating opportunities.
- **DSLR Camera for Documentation & Outreach:** Capturing the progress and stories of our children is vital for transparency, storytelling, and donor engagement. A DSLR camera would enable us to professionally document their journeys, showcase program impact, and enhance our communication with existing and potential supporters.
- Support for Orphans & Children with Disabilities: We provide specialized care and education for children with disabilities, including therapy services and adaptive learning tools. These services are resource-intensive and require dedicated funding to ensure that each child receives tailored support that meets their unique needs.
- Food & Nutritional Support: Nutrition is a cornerstone of child development. Many of the children, particularly those with disabilities, require specialized and nutrient-rich diets. We are seeking consistent support to provide balanced and sufficient meals that meet each child's dietary needs.
- **Special Education Equipment:** To effectively serve children with disabilities, we need special education materials, including sensory toys, educational tablets, adaptive learning tools, block letters, numbers, and picture cards. These resources are critical for facilitating learning and therapy in a way that is accessible and engaging for each child.
- Additional Support Staff: With the growing needs of our children, ECM is stretched thin. We require additional caregivers, teachers, and therapists to maintain the quality of care, ensure personalized attention, and expand our capacity to serve more children with excellence.
- Food Storage & Juice Preparation Equipment: We also urgently need a deep freezer to store
 perishable food items safely and in larger quantities. In addition, a blender will support our
 nutrition program by enabling us to prepare fresh juices and special meals, particularly for children
 who require softer or liquid diets.

5. CHALLENGES

Empowered Child Ministries faced numerous challenges throughout the month of June, many of which impacted our ability to provide consistent care, education, and emotional support to the children.

- Missed Birthday Celebrations: Unfortunately, due to lack of funds, we were unable to
 celebrate the birthday of *Denise*. These moments are important for the children's emotional
 well-being and sense of belonging, and we hope to restore this tradition in the coming months.
- Delayed School Reopening: The transition to our new home resulted in a three-week delay in children returning to school. This move, coupled with logistical difficulties and the failure of our June education fundraiser to reach its target, meant children did not receive the necessary scholastic materials on time, impacting their academic progress.
- Insufficient Education Support for Children with Disabilities: Financial constraints led to the loss of one of our specialized educators. Currently, only one teacher is supporting all children with disabilities, stretching our capacity and affecting the quality of individualized attention and care these children require.
- Limited Physiotherapy Services: Access to essential therapy services was also reduced due to lack of funding. Several children missed their scheduled physiotherapy sessions, impacting their developmental progress and recovery.
- Inconsistent Financial Support: The ministry continues to struggle with unstable and unpredictable funding. This affects our ability to provide regular meals, purchase medications, and cover operational costs. Several children fell ill this month, and we were unable to meet all their medical needs.
- **High Sponsorship Gap**: At present, 34 children remain unsponsored. This poses a serious challenge in securing their school fees, healthcare, and daily living necessities. Without committed sponsors, it is difficult to plan or provide consistent services.
- Food and Basic Supply Shortages: Our food reserves and essential household supplies are critically low. We are in urgent need of cooking stoves and new saucepans to make our kitchen safer and more efficient. Without intervention, we risk compromising the health and nutrition of the children.
- Lack of Emotional and Mental Health Support: Many of our children have endured trauma and need consistent emotional support. However, we currently lack the financial resources to hire professional counselors or therapists.
- Mobility Equipment in Disrepair: Several wheelchairs used by our children with disabilities
 are in poor condition and in urgent need of repair or replacement. These devices are crucial
 for the children's mobility, participation in daily activities, and access to therapy and schooling.

These challenges are significant, yet they underscore the importance of our mission and the need for strengthened donor partnerships. With consistent support, we can overcome these limitations and continue to offer every child a safe, nurturing, and empowering environment.

6. RECOMMENDATION

In response to the reduced access to physiotherapy and special needs education, **ECM is seeking** partnerships with hospitals, clinics, and universities to bring in volunteer therapists and interns. At the same time, caregivers and support staff are being trained in basic therapy techniques to ensure that children with disabilities continue receiving consistent care. Applications for grants that support inclusive education and disability programming are also being submitted to secure long-term funding for specialized staff and resources.

To tackle the issue of inconsistent financial support, **ECM is developing a monthly giving program that encourages sustained contributions from donors.** The organization is diversifying its fundraising approach by expanding into online crowdfunding, organizing community events, and forging international partnerships with churches and schools. In order to strengthen donor engagement, ECM is preparing to provide regular updates and impact reports, showcasing how contributions directly benefit the children.

As part of efforts to ensure that every child receives consistent care, **ECM** is intensifying its "Sponsor a Child" campaign to help find sponsors for the 34 children currently without one. This includes creating emotional stories and visual content that highlight the unique needs and potential of each child. ECM is also encouraging collective sponsorship models where church groups, families, or small organizations can co-sponsor a child, while introducing tiered sponsorship options for individuals with varying financial capacities.

Recognizing the critical importance of emotional and mental health, **ECM** is working to build partnerships with universities and organizations that can provide volunteer counselors and social workers. Efforts are being made to train staff in trauma-informed care and basic emotional support techniques. Additionally, ECM is creating peer mentoring groups among older children, guided by staff, to help nurture resilience and emotional well-being across the home.

Lastly, ECM is responding to the urgent need for wheelchair repairs and mobility support for children with disabilities. The team is reaching out to disability support organizations and medical equipment providers for donations and refurbishment assistance. Fundraising efforts focused on mobility needs are being planned, and ECM is also engaging local technicians and vocational schools to assist with affordable repair services.

Through these ongoing efforts, ECM remains committed to ensuring that every child in its care receives not only the basic necessities but also the love, support, and specialized services needed to thrive.
